Important Travel Information

- Documents: You'll need a valid passport that's valid for at least six months after your stay.
- Visas: You may need a visitor visa, also known as a tourist visa, if you're traveling for tourism or business. If you need a visa letter, please reach out to miamiisp@endeavor.org for assistance. Our team will provide a letter to support your travel to the ISP.
- In Miami the official currency is the US Dollar (USD). Credit cards are widely accepted, but it's good to carry some cash for small purchases or tips. Credit cards from any country work throughout Miami (at hotels, shops, restaurants, car-rental agencies, tour companies and so on); Visa, MasterCard, and American Express are the most widely accepted.
- Miami is in the Eastern Time Zone (ET)
- English is the official language, but Spanish is also widely spoken due to the large Hispanic population. You'll often find bilingual signs and menus.
- *Tipping is customary in Miami*. In restaurants, a tip of 15-20% is common. Taxi drivers, hotel staff, and service providers usually expect tips too.
- We have two associated plug types, Types A and B. Plug type A is the plug which has two flat parallel pins and plug type B is the plug which has two flat parallel pins and a grounding pin.

- In Miami (and the rest of Florida), the sales tax is a 6% state tax on most goods and services, with additional local surtaxes that can vary by county. In Miami-Dade County, the total sales tax rate is typically 7% due to a 1% county surtax.
- Miami is a melting pot of cultures, particularly with influences from the Caribbean and Latin America. Expect to experience a vibrant mix of foods and music.



Getting around Miami



Some parts of Miami, like South Beach, Brickell, and Downtown Miami, are very walkable. Walking is a great way to explore these areas and avoid parking hassles.



Metrorail & Metromover

Miami's Metrorail is an elevated train system that runs north to south, connecting key areas like Downtown Miami, Brickell, and the Miami International Airport (MIA).

The Metromover is free and can help you bypass Downtown and Brickell. A single Metrorail trip costs \$2.25. Visitors may find the Metrorail convenient for trips to Coconut Grove, Coral Gables, Vizcaya, or for travel to and from Miami International Airport.



Miami offers free trolley services that run through various neighborhoods, including Coral Gables, Coconut Grove, and Miami Beach.

Trolley service starts at 6:30am on weekdays and Saturdays and runs through 11pm on most routes. Service runs from 8am to 8pm on Sundays.



Are widely available in Miami, making it easy to get around without a car.

Today, English and Spanish are the most commonly spoken languages in Miami, reflecting the city's vibrant, multicultural makeup. But before Miami became the melting pot it is today, its native inhabitants, the Tequesta, had their own language and culture. Over time, waves of immigrants from Cuba, Haiti, Venezuela, and other Latin American countries have brought their languages and traditions, with Spanish becoming a dominant force.

Stone Crab Claws: Stone crab season is from October to May, so try these at Joe's Stone Crab for the ultimate Miami experience.


Pastelitos: Sweet or savory, these pastries filled with guava, cheese, or meat are perfect for breakfast or a snack.

Mojitos: A refreshing Cuban cocktail made with rum, mint, lime juice, sugar, and soda water. Perfect for cooling off in the Miami heat!







From Miami to Everglades 2 hr 14 min (105.1 miles)

From Miami to Marco Island 2 hr 14 min (105.1 miles)

Relax on Tigertail Beach, a pristine beach known for birdwatching and kayaking.

For lunch try one of the island's seafood restaurants like CJ's on the Bay or The Oyster Society for fresh catch and waterfront views.





Naples



From Miami to Naples 2h 16m (127 miles)

Theme Parks & Entertainment

1 Walt Disney World Resort

Traveling to Orlando from Miami



Distance: About 250 miles (3 hour 46 min drive)

What to Do: The iconic resort includes four major parks:



Magic Kingdom: Home to Cinderella's Castle, classic rides like Space Mountain, and nightly fireworks.

Epcot: Explore futuristic attractions and world cultures at the World Showcase.

Disney's Hollywood Studios: Features Star Wars: Galaxy's Edge, Toy Story Land, and exciting shows.

Disney's Animal Kingdom: A mix of thrilling rides like Expedition Everest, live animals, and Avatar: Flight of Passage in Pandora.

Tip: Plan ahead with park reservations and consider staying at a Disney hotel for perks like early park access.

Universal Orlando Resort

Traveling to Orlando from Miami



Distance: About 250 miles (3 hour 46 min drive)

What to Do:



Universal Studios Florida: Home to rides based on popular movies like Harry Potter, Fast & Furious, and The Simpsons.



Islands of Adventure: Features exciting coasters and immersive worlds like The Wizarding World of Harry Potter – Hogsmeade, Jurassic Park, and Marvel Super Hero Island.



Volcano Bay: A tropical-themed water park with slides, lazy rivers, and a wave pool.

Highlight: Don't miss The Wizarding World of Harry Potter, where you can ride the Hogwarts Express between parks and sip on Butterbeer.

3 SeaWorld Orlando

Traveling to Orlando from Miami



Distance: About 250 miles (3 hour 46 min drive)

What to Do:

Experience thrilling rides like Mako, one of Orlando's tallest coasters, and Infinity Falls, along with spectacular marine life shows featuring dolphins, orcas, and sea lions. You can also explore the interactive Antarctica: Empire of the Penguin exhibit.





Highlight: SeaWorld is known for its impressive roller coasters, including the new Pipeline, which simulates the sensation of surfing.

4 LEGOLAND Florida Resort

Traveling to Orlando from Miami



Distance: About 250 miles (3 hour 46 min drive)

What to Do:

A perfect park for families with young kids, LEGOLAND features interactive rides, shows, and displays made entirely from LEGO bricks. There's also LEGOLAND Water Park for water-based fun.





Highlight: Explore Miniland USA, with detailed LEGO replicas of U.S. landmarks.

Distance: About 70 miles (1-1.5 hours drive)

Things to Do in Palm Beach:



Visit Worth Avenue: Known for its upscale shops, boutiques, and art galleries, Worth Avenue is perfect for window shopping or indulging in a little retail therapy.

Relax at Palm Beach: Enjoy the beautiful sandy beaches, where you can sunbathe, swim, or take a leisurely stroll along the shore.

Play a Round of Golf:

The Breakers Palm Beach: Experience a luxurious round at this historic resort's par-72 course, known for its stunning views and classic design.

Palm Beach Golf Club: A private course renowned for its beautiful layout and challenging holes, it's a great option for avid golfers.
